	<p>marriage, she initiated prosecution proceedings against Ramesh for the offence of bigamy. Ramesh pleaded as:</p> <p>(i) his marriage to Rashmi was not valid under Prohibition of Child Marriages Act 2006, and</p> <p>(ii) at the time of second marriage, he was a Muslim which permits bigamy. So he cannot be prosecuted for bigamy.</p>		
Q 11	<p>Zubeda and Aslam married in 2003 at Delhi. Zubeda left Aslam a month after and went to her parents place and despite Aslam's best efforts did not agree to reconciliation.
