	Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday said that a sound data governance framework is a priority for the government and that with the rapid increase in the use of technology, data protection as well as cybersecurity becomes very important. "Our youth can play a big role in developing robust cybersecurity solutions. These solutions can effectively vaccinate digital products against cyber-attacks and viruses," he said during his address at Bengaluru Tech Summit 2020.		

"We launched the Digital India mission five years back. I am glad to say that Digital India is no longer being seen as any regular government mission, it has become a way of life particularly for the poor, marginalized and for those in government,"

"Our government has successfully created a market for digital and tech solutions, but it has made technology a key part of all schemes....Our government has used the power of data analytics to ensure better service delivery and efficiency,"

When the COVID-19 pandemic struck the country, with cases rising from February onward, tech companies in India sprung into action and began working on solutions to enable people to work from home, ensuring access to essential goods and services, the Prime Minister said.
